Por Mi Familia COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic

Holy Family Memorial, Crusaders of Justicia, Forward Latino, and the Manitowoc County Health Department hosted “POR MI FAMILIA” (FOR MY FAMILY), a COVID-19 vaccination event in Manitowoc.

Hispanics currently comprise Wisconsin’s largest minority community and per the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, has been disproportionately impacted by the pandemic. Hispanics also trail their white Wisconsin counterparts when it comes to getting vaccinated.

While outreach efforts for this vaccination event were focused on the Hispanic community, individuals of all races and ethnicities ages 12 and older were invited to come and get their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. A second event was also scheduled to administer the second dose of vaccine.

In all, 20 people received their first dose; 16 had their second dose and 4 people who had prior commitments were referred to schedule with Holy Family Memorial or another retail pharmacy on their own time.



Medication Take Back Event Successful

Holy Family Memorial collaborated with the Manitowoc County Sheriff’s Department, Manitowoc Metro Drug Unit, Manitowoc Police Department, and Manitowoc County Recycling Center to host a Medication Take Back event last spring.

The event provided community members a chance to safely dispose of unused medications. Approximately 352 pounds of medications was collected during the event.

Diabetes Support Group

Support is an important part of an individual’s diabetes management. Holy Family Memorial offers a bi-monthly Diabetes Support Group led by a registered nurse and registered dietitian. The support group provides education and social and emotional support for individuals with prediabetes, Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes and caregivers.

In fiscal 2021, 14 individuals received support through the program.

HFM Blood Drives Collect Enough Donations to Save 201 Lives


Every few seconds, someone in the United States is in need of a blood donation. During the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, many of the blood drives held throughout the community were canceled.

Holy Family Memorial (HFM) partnered with Versiti BloodCenter of Wisconsin to provide a safer environment to donate blood and encourage community members to donate blood to bolster the critical blood shortage.

Last year, HFM hosted three community blood drives, collecting 67 units of blood to save up to 201 lives.
